There was an expert in the religious law who came to trap Jesus by asking him what he must do to inherit eternal life, then Jesus asked him what the law says, and the lawyer answered correctly but answering the lawyers question "who is my neighbors?" Jesus said;

A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and felt among thieves, stripped him of his clothing wounded him and departed, leaving him half dead now by chance a certain priest came down that road. And when he arrives the place, came and looked and passed on the other side but a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed came where he was and when he saw him, he had compassion so he went to him an bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine, and he set him on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him on the next day, when he departed, he

Jesus calls on people to love and care without boundary, Leaders are to render service to humanity without minding where the people are coming from but for the fact that God connected them together even if it's by chance they are to show them love. The Samaritan become a figure when he renders selfless service to a man henever knew before, he was not a politician but know what it means to be blessed and also the purpose of wealth (Pandang 77). The bible says;

Conclusion

We must therefore, as a matter of urgency make ourselves relevant because we are a constituency that cannot afford to be spectators but participant (Sunday 67). Recommendations
